1530. SHRI MARGANI BHARAT:

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of domestic production, consumption and demand of paper for newspaper industry in the country during each of the last five years and the current year;
- (b) whether it is true that newspaper industry is importing huge quantity of newsprint;
- (c) if so, the details of newsprint being imported and import duty imposed on newsprint during the said period;
- (d) whether any request has been received from Indian News Service (INS) to bring down the import duty on newsprint; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the action taken in this regard?

ANSWER

- (a) Ministry of Information and Broadcasting does not maintain such data of paper for newspaper industry.
- (b) & (c) The import of newsprint by newspaper industry has declined in FY 2021-22 viz a viz FY 2017-18. The details of newsprint imported in last five years is as under:

Earlier, Basic Customs Duty (BCD) rate of 10% was imposed on newsprint. BCD rate on newsprint was subsequently reduced from 10% to 5% w.e.f 02.02.2020.

(d) & (e) Representations are received from the industry requesting for reduction/exemption from custom duties which are examined by Ministry of Finance. Custom duty on newsprint was reduced from 10% to 5% w.e.f 02.02.2020.
