- (d) the number of Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals commissioned so far along with the number of places identified for development of GSTS in the country, State/UT-wise particularly in Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan;
- (e) the other measures being taken by the Government to develop more terminals for handling rail cargo; and
- (f) the time by which these are likely to be developed?

- (a) Yes, Sir. Government has launched PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan (NMP) in October, 2021 for the development of multimodal connectivity infrastructure to various Economic Zones.
- (b) The PM Gati Shakti NMP depicts the economic zones and the infrastructure linkages required to support them with an objective holistically integrate all the multimodal to connectivity infrastructure projects and remove gaps for seamless movement of people and goods. It provides a GIS-based technology platform called NMP as an analytical tool to facilitate integrated planning and synchronized implementation of the projects through informed decision making by utilizing the relevant database available on the NMP.
- (c) PM Gati Shakti is not a scheme. Across Indian Railways, 209
 Railway Projects (New Line, Gauge Conversion & Doubling) of total
 length of 17,256 Km have been identified under PM GatiShakti
 National Master Plan (NMP). In the Financial year 2022-23, a budget
 Outlay of approx. ₹42,499 crore has been provided for these works.
 Zonal Railway wise details of Railway projects including cost,
 expenditure and outlay are made available in public domain on
 Indian Railways website i.e. www.indianrailways.gov.in >Ministry of

(d): So far, 11 Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals (GCTs) have been commissioned under the Gati Shakti Cargo Terminal scheme. Around 93 more locations have been provisionally identified for development of GCTs in the country, which includes 3 locations in Tamil Nadu and 2 locations in Rajasthan. State-wise distribution of identified locations for GCTs is given below:

(e): A policy on development of good-sheds had been introduced with the aim of augmenting terminal capacity through private participation by allowing setting up a new goods-shed facilities and developing existing goods-sheds.

(f): Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals (GCTs), as identified, are targeted to be commissioned within next three financial years (i.e. up to 2024-25).
