Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is implementing Mission Parivaar Vikas programme;
- (b) if so, the details of aims and objective of the programme thereof;
- (c) the number of districts covered under Mission Parivar Vikas Programme and the achievement made since its inception;
- (d) the challenges faced by the government while implementing the programme;
- (e) whether the Government has been able to achieve the desired results after implementing the National Family Welfare Programme, if so, the details thereof and if not, the corrective steps taken in this regard;
- (f) whether certain States/UTs have not utilized the funds provided to them and also target fixed has not been achieved and if so, the action taken by the Union Government in this regard; and
- (g) the steps taken by the Government to meet the goal of achieving Total Fertility Rate of 2.1 by 2025?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (d) The Government launched Mission Parivar Vikas (MPV) in 2016 for substantially increasing access to family planning services in 146 high fertility Districts with Total Fertility Rate (TFR) of 3 and above in seven high focus States (Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Assam). In November 2021, the Scheme was extended to remaining districts of the seven high focus States and all districts of six North Eastern States (Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Tripura, Nagaland and Mizoram), where the modern contraceptive usage is low and unmet need for Family Planning is high.

The Scheme aims to improve access to contraceptives, generate awareness through promotional schemes like Nayi Pahel Kit, Saas Bahu Sammelan, mobile vans (SAARTHI), and ensure commodity security.

MPV States have shown substantial decline in Total Fertility Rate (TFR) from NFHS 4 (2015-16) to NFHS 5 (2019-21):

- Assam- 2.2 to 1.9
- Bihar- 3.4 to 3.0
- Chhattisgarh- 2.2 to 1.8
- Jharkhand- 2.6 to 2.3
- Madhya Pradesh-2.3 to 2.0
- Rajasthan- 2.4 to 2.0
- Uttar Pradesh- 2.7 to 2.4

(e) The Government's efforts have been successful in reining in the growth of population, and the following progress has been achieved:

- 1. The **Total Fertility Rate (TFR)** has declined from **2.2** (2015-16) to **2.0** in 2019-21 (NFHS) which is below replacement level.
- 31 out of 36 States/ UTs have achieved replacement level fertility of 2.1 or less (NFHS 5).
- 3. The Modern Contraceptive usage has increased from 47.8% (2015-16) to 56.5% in 2019-21 (NFHS).
- 4. The Unmet Need for Family Planning has declined from 12.9% (2015-16) to 9.4% in 2019-21 (NFHS).
- 5. The Crude Birth Rate (CBR) has declined from 20.8 (2015) to 19.7 in 2019 (SRS).

(f) Under NHM, the allocations are made in flexible pools, whereas approvals are given activity wise to provide greater flexibility to States/UTs for utilizing these funds.

State/UT wise Approvals and Utilisation towards Family Planning under RCH Flexible Pool from F.Y. 2019-20 to 2021-22 is given at Annexure.

(g) Steps taken by the Government:

- 1. Expanded Contraceptive Choices
- 2. **Mission Parivar Vikas** (MPV) is implemented in 13 states for substantially increasing access to contraceptives and family planning services.
- 3. **Compensation scheme for sterilization acceptors** which provides compensation for loss of wages to the beneficiary and also to the service provider team for conducting sterilization.
- 4. **Post-partum Intra-uterine contraceptive device** (PPIUCD) services are provided post delivery.
- 5. Scheme for **Home Delivery of contraceptives** by ASHAs at doorstep of beneficiaries.
- 6. **Family Planning Logistics Management Information System** (FP-LMIS): A dedicated software to ensure smooth forecasting, procurement and distribution of family planning commodities across all the levels of health facilities.
