#### **CHANGE IN RATE OF MIGRATION**

## 2173. DR. SANJEEV KUMAR SINGARI:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether migration among Indian citizens have registered any significant change over the last two years and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government has conducted any study to identify the change in rate of migration among Indian citizens in the post COVID-19 pandemic period; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

## ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS [SHRI V. MURALEEDHARAN]

(a) While a large number of Indian workers particularly in the Gulf returned to India due to COVID-19, the economic recovery in that region and their increasing openness to travel from India has now seen a return by many of them. As per the e-Migrate portal total 4,16,114 Emigration Clearance (EC) were issued for ECR countries during the period  $1^{\rm st}$  January, 2020 to  $20^{\rm th}$  July, 2022 as per details hereunder.

(b) & (c) A study titled 'Impact of COVID-19 on India's International Migration' was conducted by the India Centre for Migration (ICM), a research think tank of the Ministry of External Affairs, in March 2021 to analyse the impact of Covid-19 on international migration from India with a focus on GCC countries. Migration trend from India to GCC countries for the year 2020, 2021 and 2022 is as follows:-
