Will the Minister of **HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- a) the total number of skill centres established in the country under the scheme Human Resource Development for Emergency Medical Services;
- b) whether the government has details regarding the number of skill centres established in the medical colleges of Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh;
- c) if so, the details thereof along with the names of those medical colleges;
- d) the State-wise accumulated details of the allocation of funds for infrastructure and procurement of training equipment;
- e) whether the Government has plans to spread the awareness about the Emergency Medical Services amongst the rural population; and
- f) whether the Government has data regarding the beneficiaries under this scheme and if so, the State-wise details thereof?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE
(DR BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)**

(a) to (f): Human Resource Development for Emergency Medical Services is a central sector scheme which intends to create a pool of trained doctors, nurses and paramedics in the country with skills to provide standardized emergency life support measures to reduce mortality and morbidity due to medical emergencies in the country.

The scheme provides for setting up and equipping Skill Centers in Medical Colleges/ Institution along with development of standardized course materials for training of doctors, nurses and paramedics to impart skill-based training in emergency life support.

As on 26th July, 2022, a total of 91 Skill Centers located in 27 States/UTs are in various stages of development. Details are placed at **Annexure I**.

Details regarding medical colleges of Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh which have been nominated and approved for setting up these Skill Centres is at **Annexure II**.

State/UT wise details of funds released for developing infrastructure and procurement of training equipment is at **Annexure III**.

Master trainers developed under the scheme provide training to health functionaries at District/ Sub-District Level Health Care Facilities in a cascaded fashion in respective States/UTs. The scheme is indented to improve emergency patient management and benefits the community at large, both in urban and rural settings.
