SCHEMES IN TELANGANA

2351. DR. G. RANJITH REDDY:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Centrally Sponsored Schemes and Central Sector Schemes being implemented by the Government in the state of Telangana during the last five years and the current year, year/schemes/district-wise;
- (b) the details of funds allocated, sanctioned, released and utilized for each of the above scheme during the last five years and the current year, year/schemes/district-wise;
- (c) the details of physical targets set and achieved while implementing above schemes during the last five years and the current year, year/schemes/district-wise;
- (d) whether the Government has found any shortcomings while implementing above schemes and, if so, the corrective measures taken to fix those shortcomings;
- (e) whether there is time and cost overrun of any of the above scheme; and
- (f) if so, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

**MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF
SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP
(SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)**

(a) The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is delivering skills through following skill development schemes across the country including the State of Telangana. The schemes implemented by the Ministry are:

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY): Under the scheme, skill training is provided to youth belonging to all sections of the society, in various sectors as per the need of the market demand.

Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS): Scheme of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (NGOs) for Skill Development to impart vocational skills in non-formal mode to non-literate, neo-literates, persons with rudimentary level of education upto 8th and school drop-outs upto 12th standard in the age group of 15-45 years. The priority groups are women, SC, ST, minorities and other backward sections of the society.

National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS): This Scheme is for promoting apprenticeship training and increasing the engagement of apprentices by providing financial support to industrial establishments undertaking apprenticeship program under The Apprentices Act, 1961.

Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)/ Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS): This scheme is for providing long-term training through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) operational across the country. The ITIs offer a range of vocational/skill training courses covering a large number of economic sectors with an objective of providing skilled workforce to the industry as well as self-employment of youth.

(b) Year-wise and district-wise funds disbursed for Telangana State under PMKVY, NAPS and JSS during last five years and the current year (till 30th June 2022) is at **Annexure-I, Annexure-II and Annexure-III respectively.**

(c) The schemes of the Ministry are demand-driven and, hence, targets are often not set or achieved State-wise. However, Under Skill India Mission, the Ministry of Skill Development (MSDE) has been delivering short term skills through Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme and National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), and long-term skills through Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to the youth across the country. The details of youths trained under different said schemes viz. PMKVY, NAPS, JSS, CTS/ITIs year wise and district wise for the State of Telangana for last five years and current year are placed at **Annexure- IV, Annexure-V, Annexure-VI and Annexure-VII** respectively.

(d) In order to address the incremental manpower requirement and to empower youth with adequate skills, Skill India Mission was launched in 2015. Under Skill India Mission, the Government through more than 20 Central Ministries/Departments is implementing various skill development schemes across the country. Major skill development training schemes/programmes, being implemented by Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, are Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS).

The advocacy of the programmes is being done through Print Media, Electronic Media and State Governments. The Ministry is continuously redesigning its programmes and procedures on the basis of suggestions from stakeholders, especially with an aim of introducing ease of Doing Business at every level so that the skilling ecosystem in the country runs smoothly. In doing so, suggestions/directions from the Department Related Parliamentary Standing Committee (DRPSC) and findings of the Third-Party Evaluation Reports are always taken into account.

Skill India is a continuous dynamic programme that adapts changing needs of skills and opportunities. MSDE has made various efforts at the institutional and structural levels to rationalise and streamline the entire skill development process such as–

i. **Standardization of input quality through SMART Portal** - Skill Management & Accreditation of Training Centre (SMART) is an accreditation and affiliation platform developed by NSDC to bring about uniformity in the process of accreditation and affiliation and improve quality assurance across training centres.

ii. **Data convergence on the Skill India Portal** – The Skill India Portal has been brought into existence to ensure data congruence and converge data relating to all skilling programmes in the country including Central Ministries, State Governments and corporations on one platform. This is a process in progress with this integration, the Skill India Portal would provide an accurate estimation and planning for training program, reduction in duplication and wasteful expenditure and better visibility of the entire skill ecosystem.

iii. **National Portal for Trainers and Assessors** - Takshashila, a dedicated online portal, has been set up by MSDE for the management of trainers and assessors of the skill ecosystem, functioning as the central repository of information concerning development of quality Trainers and Assessors.

iv. To impart **digital skilling** for the youth in the post covid scenario and to address the requirements of Industrial Revolution 4.0, online Skill training is being imparted through eSkill India portal, Bharat Skills portal, future Skills prime platform for reskilling, up-skilling of IT manpower for employability. Further, blended learning through Digital vocational education and training courses to augment learning of ITI students across the country is being introduced in various fields of skilling .
