RURAL HEALTHCARE

278. SHRI SUSHIL KUMAR SINGH:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry has undertaken any efforts toward rural healthcare;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the amount spent by the Ministry on the development schemes in rural areas of Aurangabad and Gaya during each of the last five years, State-wise, district-wise?

(a) to (c): The only scheme through which Ministry directly invests is Shyama Prasad MukherjiRurban Mission (SPMRM). It focuses on holistic development of clusters and to ensure an optimum level of development of rural areas. Twenty one components have been suggested as desirable for the cluster development. Based on the needs of a cluster, different activities are undertaken for holistic development, out of which Health is one of the components, several States/UTs have taken up different projects under the scheme to provide better health care services in the rural areas aggregating Rs. 564 Cr. Under the scheme, two clusters viz. Nauranga and Tankuppa have been approved in Gaya district of the State of Bihar, which have components aimed at augmenting the healthcare infrastructure at a total cost of Rs. 10 Cr.

Though on the whole, Ministry of Rural Development does not implement any scheme directly related to rural healthcare, however, several schemes of this Ministry are designed in such a way that they support enhancement of quality of living, nutrition and access to healthcare. Towards this goal of improving overall quality of rural living, this Ministry implements the scheme of Pradhan MantriAwaasYojana- Gramin (PMAY-G) with a target of “Housing for All”. With effect from 1st April 2016 the Ministry provides assistance to eligible rural households with an overall target to construct 2.95 crore pucca houses with basic amenities by March, 2024. PMAY-G provides financial assistance for construction of houses to eligible rural houseless households and households living kutchcha and dilapidated houses.

In addition, the Department of Rural Development is also implementing a number of developmental and welfare schemes for rural areas of the country, namely, Mahatma Gandhi

National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (Mahatma Gandhi NREGS), Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), Deen Dayal Upadhyay – Gramin Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY), Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETIs) and National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) to alleviate poverty in rural areas and to bring about overall improvement in the quality of life of the people in rural areas.

Another scheme of this Ministry, namely, Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) aims at the holistic and integrated development of Gram Panchayats and covers various aspects of development such as economic, human, personal, social, environmental, health etc. by facilitating convergence of various schemes of the Government and through such accelerated and wholesome development facilitates improved health outcomes.

The amount spent by the Ministry on the development schemes in rural areas during each of the last five years, State-wise, is given at Annexure.
