Will the **PRIME MINISTER** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of existing vacancies in various ranks of Central Government Service as of now, State-wise;
- (b) the steps taken by the Government to fill the vacancies;
- (c) whether it is true that above 22% of the Government posts are lying vacant;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether the severe shortage of employees affecting the functioning of governance; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and the action taken to fill the vacant posts on urgent basis?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR. JITENDRA SINGH)

(a): As per the Annual Report of Pay Research Units of the Department of Expenditure, the details of the vacancies in Central Government including Group A, B and C, as on 01.03.2021 is as below:

However, State-wise data is not maintained.

(b) to (f): Creation and filling up of posts in the Central Government is responsibility of the concerned Ministry/Department and it is a continuous process. Vacancies in various Ministries/Departments of the Central Government, their attached/subordinate offices arise due to retirement, promotion, resignation, death etc. All Ministries/Departments of the Central Government have been asked to take action in a mission mode for filling up of vacant posts in a time bound manner.
