PROMOTION OF AGRICULTURE/COTTAGE INDUSTRIES

3066. SHRI SANJAY SETH:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is running any scheme for the promotion of agriculture based industries and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the steps taken by the Government for the promotion of cottage and small industries and the number of people in Jharkhand benefitted from the above steps along with the district-wise details thereof; and
- (c) the details and number of people/groups in Jharkhand provided assistance by the Government in the field of employment generation, district-wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI BHANU PRATAP SINGH VERMA)

- (a): Ministry of MSME, through Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) is promoting non-farm agro based and food processing industries under Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Khadi Gramodyog Vikas Yojana, and 'Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries' (SFURTI) schemes. The details of these Schemes are provided as under:
 - 1. **Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP)**: PMEGP is a major credit-linked subsidy programme being implemented through Banks since 2008-09 with KVIC as nodal agency at the national level for generating employment in the country by setting up of micro-enterprises. Under PMEGP, general category beneficiaries can avail of margin money subsidy of 25% of the project cost in rural areas and 15% in urban areas. For beneficiaries belonging to special categories such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Minorities, women, ex-servicemen, physically handicapped, beneficiaries belonging to North Eastern Region, hill and border areas, etc., the margin money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban areas. The maximum cost of project is Rs.50 lakh in the manufacturing sector and Rs.20 lakh in the service sector. Since 2018-19, the financial assistance is also introduced for expansion/upgrading of the existing PMEGP/ Rural Employment Generation Programme (REGP)/ Micro Units Development & Refinance Agency Ltd (MUDRA) units. The number of projects setup under PMEGP, the amount of Margin Money disbursed by the Government and the employment generated during the last three years is as follows:

2. Through **Khadi Gramodyog Vikas Yojana** (**KGVY**), capacity building, technology support and hand holding are provided to Village Industries, which covers village oil industry, aromatic oil, honey and bee-keeping, palm gur and other palm products, fruit and vegetable processing industry, pulses and cereals processing industry, spices and condiments processing industry, gur and khandsari industry, collection of minor forest produce, bamboo, cane & reed Industry, organic dying industry, medicinal plants collection and processing industry etc. To promote the honey and bee-keeping industry, Government of India launched Honey Mission in 2017-18 to supplement income of farmers and unemployed youth. After requisite training of 5 days duration, 10 Bee-Boxes along with beehives are given to each beneficiary, under this Mission. The number of beneficiaries of Honey Mission, and the number of bee-boxes distributed during the last three years is as given below:

- 3. Ministry of MSME is also implementing 'Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries' (SFURTI) Scheme on cluster basis in which the project/activities under Agro Based Industries are encouraged. The Scheme envisages providing need based assistance to traditional village industries for replacement of production equipment, setting up of Common Facility Centres (CFC), product development, quality improvement, improved marketing, training and Capacity Building, etc. As on date, 498 clusters have been approved and they are under various stages of implementation. Out of 498 SFURTI clusters, 251 clusters of rural and traditional industrial units are functional.

Details of the steps taken by the Ministry of MSME for the promotion of rural agro-based micro and small industries in the country:

- i) KVIC has launched "Khadi Prakritik Paint", developed by Kumarappa National Handmade Paper Institute (KNHPI), Jaipur, a unit of KVIC. Khadi Prakritik Paint manufacturing units are being set up under PMEGP scheme.
- ii) KVIC has started online selling of all Khadi and Village Industry products, which are available to every Indian's door step through www.ekhadiindia.com and www.khadiindia.gov.in.
- iii) Awareness camps, workshops, Bankers Meetings and exhibitions at all levels are being organized in order to propagate the Khadi and Village Industries (KVI) schemes for generation of employment opportunities.
- iv) Publicity of Khadi and Village Industries schemes and programmes through print, electronic, digital and social media.
- v) KVIC has started online Registration of new Khadi Institutions through Khadi Institution Registration and Certification Sewa (KIRCS) for undertaking Khadi activities by the new entities.
- vi) An online portal has been made operational for disbursement of funds under the Modified Market Development Assistance (MMDA) and Interest Subsidy Eligibility Certificate (ISEC) schemes to Khadi Institutions and artisans. Institutions are uploading data and filing their MMDA and ISEC claims from the financial year 2016-17 onwards in the DBT Portal.
