NO. 3117. SHRI SUNIL BABURAO MENDHE:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of works done under Jal Jeevan Mission Urban in the State of Maharashtra during the last three years, district-wise;**
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned, allocated and spent for these works during the last three years and the current year; and**
- (c) the number of houses in which tap water has been supplied and the number of houses that are still left out under the said mission in Maharashtra, district-wise?**

(a): The proposed Jal Jeevan Mission – Urban scheme has been launched as Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation 2.0 (AMRUT 2.0) for a period of 05 years i.e. from the financial year 2021-22 to 2025-26. The mission aims at making the cities ‘water secure’ and provide universal coverage of water supply through functional taps to all households in all the statutory towns in the country. Mission also aims at providing sewage/septage management to all households of 500 cities covered in first phase of the AMRUT scheme.

AMRUT 2.0 was launched last year i.e. on 01 October 2021. For the State of Maharashtra, Special State Water Action Plan (S-SWAP) for rejuvenation of water bodies have been approved by this Ministry in the current financial year for 77 projects costing ₹570.515 crore, including committed Central Assistance of ₹180.81 crore. Recently, State Government has also submitted tranche-1 of their SWAP (SWAP-1) for 115 projects costing ₹19,636.90 crore, including committed Central Assistance of ₹5,522.61 crore, to this Ministry for approval.

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(b): Under AMRUT 2.0, Central funds for the States/ Union Territories have been sanctioned/ allocated for the entire Mission period and not year-wise. For the State of Maharashtra, Central Assistance of ₹9,285 crore has been allocated for the entire Mission period towards implementation of projects to be taken up under AMRUT 2.0. Apart from this, an amount of ₹301.71 crore has also been allocated towards Administrative & Other Expenses (A&OE) for the entire Mission period.

The details of Central funds released to the State of Maharashtra so far under AMRUT 2.0 in the last three financial years and the current year is as under:
