3199. SHRI B.N. BACHE GOWDA:

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that the capital city of Bangalore is facing lot of traffic congestion and if so, the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (b) whether the Government proposes to establish a new elevated corridor upto Hosakote, Bangalore Rural District and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether development of a peripheral ring road in Bangalore city was notified in 2005 and if so, the details and the present status thereof;
- (d) whether it is fact that despite land acquisition of about 2560 acres so far, the work has not started thereon and if so, the reaction of the Government thereto; and
- (e) the steps taken by the Government to complete the projects expeditiously?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

(a) to (e) Due to traffic congestion in Bengaluru city, Government has taken up the development of Bengaluru Ring Road (Satellite Ring Road for Bengaluru City) under Bharatmala Pariyojana in a phased manner.

A Satellite township Ring Road to Bengaluru City (total length of about 288 Km consisting of NH 648, NE 7 & NH 948A) has been envisaged. Out of 3 Packages on NH 648 (101 km), work on 2 packages (80 km) is in progress with completion by 2023 and remaining package (21 km) is going to commence shortly with completion by 2024. The work in 7 Km stretch of NE 7 (overlapping with Bengaluru Chennai Expressway Package-I) is also in progress with completion by 2023. The work on 6 packages of NH 948A (180Km) are in preappraisal and DPR stage.
