SHORTAGE OF AMBULANCE SERVICES

3274. SHRI KURUVA GORANTLA MADHAV: DR. BEESETTI VENKATA SATYAVATHI:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that as per the World Health Organisation, at least one ambulance for emergency response per lakh population is mandated and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of ambulances available under the Emergency Response Service of National Health Mission across the country; and
- (c) whether there is a shortage of ambulance services in the country and if so, the steps taken by the Government to meet the requirements of ambulance service in the country?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

(a) to (c) Under National Health Mission (NHM), technical and financial support to the States are given as per the proposals submitted by the States/UTs in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) based on the requirements, including the provision for Dial 108, Dial 102/104, Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advance Life Support (ALS) ambulances under National Ambulance Services (NAS), and the approvals are accorded as Record of Proceedings (RoP) to States/UTs. As per the current norms, it is recommended to have at least one Basic Life Support ambulance at a population of one lakh and one Advanced Life Support ambulance for population of 5 lakhs.

Dial 108 is an emergency response system, primarily designed to attend to patients of critical care, trauma and accident victims etc. Dial 102 services essentially consist of basic patient transport aimed to cater the needs of pregnant women and children, though other categories are also taking benefit and are not excluded. Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakaram (JSSK) entitlements e.g. free transfer from home to facility, inter facility transfer in case of referral and drop back for mother and children are the key focus of 102 service. For Dial 102 service and Dial 108 service, operational cost is supported under NHM.

The State/UT wise number of ambulances supported under NHM as per NHM-MIS report, as on 31st March, 2022 (as reported by States/UTs) is placed at Annexure-I.
