JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN IN TAMIL NADU

3522. SHRI T.R.V.S. RAMESH:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) has not been established in some States and UTs and if so, thereasons therefor;
- (b) the steps undertaken by the Government to expedite the process of establishing JSS in all States and UTs, especially in the State of Tamil Nadu; and
- (c) the steps undertaken by the Government to mitigate the adverse impact of Covid-19 on thefunctioning of JSS?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

- (a) The scheme of Jan Shikshan Sansthan is being implemented through NGOs in 26 States and 7 UTs across the country. At present, there is no Jan Shikshan Sansthan in the States / UTs of Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Puducherry due to non-availability of eligible NGOs and registration problem.
- (b) TheMinistry is in the process of setting up of Jan Shikshan Sansthans in 250 new districts covering all the States and UTs including 11 districts in Tamil Nadu.
- (c) The duration of the skill training has been increased from 2 hours to 3 hours per day and the training is conducted in smaller groups. The Standard Operating Procedures (SoPs) pertaining to prevention of spread of Covid-19 is being strictly followed while conducting the training.
