(b) whether NMM has been able to achieve the objective for which the NMM was established and if so, the details thereof;

(c) the total amount released by the Government for NMM during each of the last three years and the current year and the actual amount spent thereon;

(d) whether the valuable manuscripts containing the practice of Siddha and Ayurvedic Medicines were documented and if so, the details thereof; and

(e) the number of rare archives, documents and other manuscripts that have been digitized during each of the last three years and the current year?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) Yes Sir. The main objectives of National Mission for Manuscripts (NMM) is to survey, document, conserve, preserve, publish, digitize and establish a digital manuscripts library at Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA). The mission has been merged with IGNCA vide Ministry of Culture's letter No. Akad.25/4/2019-Akad./194 dated 08.04.2021 & the expenditure is being made under the General fund of IGNCA thereafter. In order to achieve its objectives, various activities, awareness programmes, workshops, seminars etc. are undertaken by NMM regularly.

Major achievements of NMM are as follows :

- 1. Documentation of manuscripts: 44,44,636
- 2. Conservation of manuscripts: 89.00 million folios
- 3. Digitization of manuscripts: 343.54 lakh pages
- 4. Publication of rare manuscripts: 110
- 5. Publication of newsletter "Kriti Rakshana": 75

- 6. Reprinting of Mongolian Kanjur: 108 volumes
- 7. Workshop on Manuscriptology & Paleography: 103
- 8. Conservation workshop: 258
- 9. Seminar: 76
