Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is focusing on implementing and adopting the best practices of various countries for skill development in the country and if so, the details thereof:
- (b) whether the Government has signed any agreement with other countries for transfer of technology in skill training and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether active cooperation is being sought in the field of creation of international exclusively through the development of international standards by ascertaining the work to be done in the job; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b) Yes Sir. Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) recognizes as the firm objective that skilling programmes are of global standards so the Ministry through National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) is focusing on implementing and adopting the best practices of various countries under the domain of skill development training. Ministry has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) with 9 countries viz; Germany, Japan, Switzerland, UAE, Qatar, China, Belarus, United Kingdom and France for cooperation in the field of vocational education and training, enhance and sharing of lessons learnt in skill development, professional education and training, mutual recognition of qualifications to facilitate mobility of skilled work force, capacity building and development of competence based curricula etc.
- (c) Yes, Sir.
- (d) MSDE through NSDC is contemplating setting up Skill India International (SII) Centres. SII Centres are aimed at providing high-quality training to Indian youth by providing skills as per the demand of the international employers in countries like United Arab Emirates (UAE), other GCC regions, Canada, Australia, Japan etc. The SII Network is envisaged to be created through empanelment of state-of-the-art government and private institutions, which have to play a pivotal role in servicing the overseas demand through the facilitation of sourcing, counselling, training, assessment, certification, recruitment, and immigration of the candidates.
