3566. SHRI GANESH SINGH: SHRI CHANDRA SEKHAR BELLANA: SHRI KARTI P. CHIDAMBARAM:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has conducted any study in regard to rise in school dropout rates especially in case of female students and if so, the details thereof State-wise, including primary and secondary dropout during the last two years;
- (b) the dropout rate for Tamil Nadu for 2020-21 and 2021-22, district-wise;
- (c) the percentage of attendance of students for 2020-21 and 2021-22;
- (d) the number of girls who have discontinued education in 2020-21 and 2021-22, State-wise;
- (e) whether there is any policy underway to bridge the educational gap of school students who were unable to access digital mode of learning during the lockdown period; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

- (a) to (d): The Department of School Education and Literacy (DoSEL), Ministry of Education has developed the Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) system to record data on indicators of school education provided by all the States and Union Territories. As per UDISE+, State-wise and gender-wise dropout rate for the year 2019-20 and 2020-21 is at annexure I and the district-wise dropout rate of Tamil Nadu for 2020-21is at annexure II.
- (e) and (f): In order to mitigate/reduce the learning losses due to Covid, the Government of India has launched PM eVIDYA program for students. Through this program, various types of online models were launched in order to provide quality education to the students and can be accessed at https://pmevidya.education.gov.in/. The other initiative to provide uninterrupted learning access

includes: Digital Infrastructure For Knowledge Sharing (DIKSHA) for providing quality e-content for school education in states/UTs, Swayam Prabha TV channel per class from Class 1 to 12 (one class, one channel), Extensive use of Radio, Community radio and CBSE Podcast-Shiksha Vani, Special e-content for visually and hearing impaired developed on Digitally Accessible Information System (DAISY). Further, students can continue to recover the losses even after school hours. The summer vacations and other vacations have been curtailed to compensate the learning losses by identifying the needy students. Also students have the choice to learn through open schools.
