3654. SHRI M.V.V. SATYANARAYANA:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the efforts undertaken by the Government under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY 3.0) to fulfil the twin objective of enabling workers to secure quality jobs and addressing the needs of employers and firms by providing them with the requisite talent for them to stay competitive;
- (b) whether the Government has taken into consideration the growing importance of remote working and increased digitalisation and automation before rolling out training programmes planned under PMKVY 3.0; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

(a) Under Skill India Mission, Ministry has launched the third phase of Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY 3.0) on 15.01.2021, to train 8.00 lakh youths across the country. Under PMKVY, training is being imparted in various National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) aligned job roles designed by industry- led Sector Skill Councils (SSCs). The job roles are reviewed and redesigned periodically as per the industries requirements.

Ministry has designed PMKVY 3.0 as a demand driven scheme where identification and mapping of job roles are based on the demand received from trainees. District Skill Committee (DSC)supports in the identification of job roles and mobilization of candidates based on requirements in various sector. Further, under PMKVY 3.0, placement is being facilitated through the involvement of DSCs and SSSCs. In addition, Ministry has lauched Aatmanirbhar Skilled Employees Employer Mapping (ASEEM) portal, which acts as a central directory of skilled workforce registered and certified under Skill India Portal (SIP), across all schemes at central and state leve.

(b) and (c) Yes, Sir. Blended Learning (Training) through digital skills is crucial in the post-COVID era to ensure skilling for youth and also to address the requirements of industry. Under PMKVY 3.0-STT, a pilot On-line/Digital (Blended) Mode of training has been conducted wherein 50% of the theory hours can be completed via online mode. Under the said initiative, 384 candidates have been trained.
