RURAL ROADS IN ODISHA

453. MS CHANDRANI MURMU:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any information regarding total length of rural roads constructed in Odisha, district-wise during the last five year;
- (b) the steps being taken by the Government to improve the conditions of rural roads in Odisha, particularly in Keonjhar HPC;
- (c) the total number of kilometres of metal roads which have been constructed in Keonjhar HPC during the said period; and
- (d) the details of funds sanctioned, released and utilised for rural development in Odisha during the said period, district-wise?

(a) The details of the works executed under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in Odisha during the last five years are as under:

The District-wise details of road length completed in Odisha during the last five years (2017-18 to 2021-22) under various interventions under PMGSY are given in **Annexure-I**.

(b) Rural roads under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) are constructed as per the technical specifications and geometric design standards given in the Ministry of Rural Development Specifications for Rural Roads, Rural Roads Manual of the Indian Roads Congress (IRC) (IRC-SP:20) and also, where required, the Hill Road Manual (IRC:SP:48) and other relevant IRC Codes & Manuals. The implementation of all sanctioned works is being monitored through online Programme Management Information System on real time basis. In addition, the progress is regularly reviewed by the Ministry by way of Regional Review Meetings (RRMs), Performance Review Committee (PRC) Meetings, Pre-

Empowered/ Empowered Committee Meetings with the States. At District level, the District Development Coordination and Monitoring Committee (DISHA) headed by Hon'ble Member of Parliament (LS) monitors the implementation of various schemes of Government of India including PMGSY. Besides, special review meetings/monthly review meetings are also held by Secretary/ Additional Secretary, Ministry of Rural Development with Chief Secretaries/Principal Secretaries of the States to take stock of the progress of the scheme and remove the bottlenecks, if any.

PMGSY has a three-tiered Quality Control mechanism for ensuring construction of quality road works and durability of road assets under PMGSY. Under the first tier, the Programme Implementation Units (PIUs) are required to ensure process control through mandatory tests on material and workmanship at the field laboratories. The second tier is a structured independent quality monitoring at the State level through State Quality Monitors (SQMs) to ensure that every work is inspected at initial stage, intermediate stage and final stage of the construction. Under the third tier, which is at the national level, independent National Quality Monitors (NQMs) are deployed for random inspection of road works to monitor quality and also to provide guidance of senior professionals to the field functionaries. Based on the periodic monitoring of quality of roads under the 3-tier mechanism, corrective measures, wherever necessary, are taken by the State Governments.

During last 5 years (2017-18 to 2021-22), National Quality Monitors (NQMs) have carried out a total of 174 inspections in the district of Keonjhar, and 4130 inspections in the state of Odisha. In the same period, State Quality Monitors (SQMs) have carried out a total of 940 inspections in the district of Keonjhar, and 20736 inspections in the state.

(c) In the Keonjhar district of Odisha, a total of 980.98 km road length has been constructed under various interventions of PMGSY during the last five years (i.e. 2017-18 to 2021-22).

(d) Central funds under PMGSY are released to State Government. Further funds are released at district and sub-district level by the State Government. The release of funds to the State for implementation of PMGSY is done on the basis of the proposal received from the state and depends, inter-alia, on works in hand, execution capacity of the State and unspent funds available with the State. The amount released to and expenditure including state share by the State of Odisha under PMGSY including Road Connectivity Project for Left Wing Extremism Affected Areas (RCPLWEA) is given below:-
