NAL JAL CONNECTION IN MADHYA PRADESH

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government of Madhya Pradesh has proposed any action plan to provide Nal Jal connection to all rural families under Jal Jivan Mission;
- (b) if so, the details of thereof; and
- (c) the total number of families who have availed the benefit of the said scheme so far with particular reference to Madhya Pradesh, district-wise?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) As reported, Government of Madhya Pradesh has been working in mission mode under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) to provide tap water supply to all rural households by 2024.

Of the remaining 73.46 lakh rural households in Madhya Pradesh, as on 1/4/22, the State Government has planned to make provision of tap water supply in 20 lakh rural households during 2022-23 and 22 lakh in 2023-24. The planning of 31.46 lakh is awaited from the State.

(c) As reported by States/ UTs, since the launch of JJM in August, 2019, provision of tap water supply has been made in more than 6.57 crore rural households in the country and as on 18.07.2022, more than 9.8 crore rural households (51%) have access to tap water supply.

In Madhya Pradesh, since launch of JJM, more than 37.6 lakh rural households (30.8%) have been provided tap water connections. Thus, as on 18.07.2022, provisions of tap water supply have been made available to more than 51.13 lakh rural households (42%) in the State. District-wise details are **annexed**.
