ONE STOP CENTRES IN ANDHRA PRADESH

969. SHRI Y.S. AVINASH REDDY: SHRIMATI CHINTA ANURADHA:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the One Stop Centres established and currently operational in the State of Andhra Pradesh, district-wise;
- (b) the details of services provided to women in the said centres;
- (c) the quantum of funds released and utilized thereunder during the last three years;
- (d) whether the Government has identified any under-utilisation of such released funds and if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the steps being taken by the Government to increase the awareness of the scheme and ensure maximum utilisation of the funds?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

- (a): The One Stop Centre (OSC) scheme implemented by the Government since 1st April, 2015 is now a component of sub-scheme 'Sambal' under umbrella scheme for safety, security and empowerment of women named 'Mission Shakti'. So far, a total of 14 One Stop Centres have been approved for 13 Districts of Andhra Pradesh, out of which 13 OSCs are functional. One additional OSC approved for Chittoor district is not functional. District-wise details of functional OSCs and number of women assisted through these OSCs are at **Annexure-I.**
- (b): OSCs are set up with the objective to provide a range of integrated services under one roof including police facilitation, medical aid, legal aid and legal counselling, psycho-social counseling and temporary shelter to women affected by violence or distress.
- (c): The quantum of fund released to OSCs in Andhra Pradesh and utilized [as per Utilization Certificates (UCs) and Statement of Expenditure (SoE) received] during the last three years is at **Annexure-II**.
- (d) & (e): One Stop Centres have been approved for all districts of Andhra Pradesh, accordingly, funds have been released to them for running the centres as per scheme

norms. Since the OSC Scheme is an ongoing scheme, all unutilised funds are available with the State Government/ District Authorities for its implementation. However, Government of India issues advisories and organizes training workshops from time to time for speedy implementation of the OSC scheme and proper utilisation of funds.

Further, the Government has taken fresh steps to provide speedy assistance and services at OSCs to women facing violence and distress under Mission Shakti. For this purpose, the Government has decided to set up more OSCs in areas which are distant from district headquarters or are having high rates of crime against women, to enhance the costing provisions for OSCs, and to further enhance the synergy and coordination of OSCs with the other initiatives of the government, including those under Nirbhaya Fund and under Mission Shakti.
