- (a) the details of criteria for selecting an Aspirational District;
- (b) whether the Government has conducted any research/study regarding the functioning of the Aspirational Districts Programme and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of funds allocated by the Government and utilised for the development of Aspirational Districts in Andhra Pradesh during the last five years;
- (d) the details regarding the performance of each Aspirational District in Andhra Pradesh during the last five years via socioeconomic and developmental outcome indicators as used by the Government along with the details of current development status of Phase 1 Aspirational Districts selected in Andhra Pradesh;
- (e) whether the Government has considered making any changes regarding the indicators used to identify a particular district as an "Aspirational District" and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) whether the Government has any plan to increase the number of recognised Aspirational Districts and if so, the details thereof?

(a). to (f): A Statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (A) TO (F) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.21* FOR 24.07.2024 REGARDING 'ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICTS' RAISED BY SHRI MAGUNTA SREENIVASULU REDDY.

- (a) The aspirational districts were selected through a transparent process on the basis of published data. List of data sets and the weight attached to them for selection of these districts is attached in Annexure I.
- (b) Yes Sir, there have been independent assessments of the functioning and impact of the Aspirational Districts Programme (ADP).
 - a. UNDP made a comprehensive appraisal of this programme
 - b. Institute for Competitiveness Assessment (a team of expert led by Prof. Michael Porter of Harvard Business school) made a detailed assessment of the programme

The UNDP report titled "Aspirational Districts Programme: An Appraisal," submitted in December 2020, confirmed that significant progress has been made in various aspects such as sector-wise growth, better governance through convergence, and accelerated development through competitive federalism. This progress has been driven by factors including strong leadership, real-time monitoring, data-driven decision-making, and capacity building.

Additionally, the Institute for Competitiveness highlighted that nearly all districts in the ADP have shown improvement on key development parameters compared to the baseline, with the programme successfully advancing social impact and justice by targeting the benefits towards the most disadvantaged areas. The delta ranking system has played a crucial role in fostering a competitive and dynamic culture, which has motivated several low-performing districts to enhance their standings over the past three years. The reports also suggested that the programme could serve as a model for future economic and social development strategies across India.

- (c) Under the Aspirational Districts Programme, districts undertake various developmental projects to address critical gaps using the performance grants they win through the programme's delta ranking method. The total funds sanctioned and utilised for the development of aspirational districts in Andhra Pradesh under the ADP is Rs. 34.2 crores and Rs.11.9 crores respectively. The details of the projects undertaken by aspirational districts of Andhra Pradesh is attached as Annexure II.
- (d) The Aspirational Districts Programme monitors the progress of Aspirational Districts on 49 Key Performance Indicators across sectors, critical for improving quality of life or economic productivity of citizens viz., health, nutrition, school education, agriculture and water resource management, financial inclusion, skill development and basic infrastructure. Details of district-wise performance for the aspirational districts of the

State of Andhra Pradesh are attached as Annexure III. The same is also available on the Champions of Change Portal (<u>http://championsofchange.gov.in/site/coc-home/</u>), which is in the public domain.

- (e) The Government has not considered making any changes regarding the indicators used to identify a particular district as an Aspirational District.
- (f) There are no plans to increase the number of selected Aspirational Districts, at present.
