(a) to (d): The Ministry of Tourism under its Swadesh Darshan scheme complements the efforts of tourism infrastructure development by financial assistance to the State Governments/UT Administrations in consultation with them. The Ministry under this scheme sanctioned 1 project 'Development of Beach Circuit: Udaipur-Digha - Shankarpur- Tajpur- Mandarmani- Fraserganj- Bakkhali- Henry Island' in 2015-16 in coastal circuit theme for Rs.67.99 Crore. project is reported physically complete. The Ministry of Tourism has recently revamped the Swadesh Darshan scheme as Swadesh Darshan 2.0 (SD 2.0) with the objective to develop sustainable and responsible tourism destinations. As per the scheme guidelines, the State Governments/UT Administrations prepare State Perspective Plans analysing tourism potential of various destinations based on the specified parameters and thereafter the destinations are shortlisted by the Ministry of Tourism for development under the scheme. The Ministry of Tourism has not received the State Perspective Plan from the State Government of West Bengal under SD 2.0.
