## SCHOOL DROPOUTS IN ASSAM

1144 Shri Pradyut Bordoloi:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) the dropout rates in primary, secondary and senior secondary level students in the State of Assam compared to the national average;

(b) the status of infrastructure development under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan in Assam, including targetted and completed projects for sanitation facilities, clean drinking water and functional libraries, segmented in urban and rural regions;

(c) the number of schools providing online teaching facilities in urban and rural areas of Assam along with the provisions made for such teaching;

(d) the percentage of students living within a radius of 3 km from a school in rural and urban areas of Assam along with correlation with absenteeism and dropout rates; and

(e) whether the Government has conducted educational awareness programmes in Assam to prevent high dropout rates, if so, the details thereof?

## ANSWER

## MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EUDCATION (SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a) As per UDISE+ 2021-22, dropout rate of students at Primary, Upper-Primary and Secondary level in Assam as compared to national average is as given below:

(b) As informed by the State Government of Assam, the status of infrastructure development under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, including projects for sanitation facilities, clean drinking water and functional libraries in rural and urban areas is attached at Annexure.

(c) As informed by the State Government of Assam, online teaching facilities consisting of Tele-Education facilities and Smart Classrooms are available in 6737 Upper Primary and Secondary Schools in the State. Out of these, 663 Schools are in urban areas and 6074 Schools are in rural areas.

(d) No such data is maintained by the State Government.

(e) As informed by the State Government of Assam, various activities have been conducted at the State level to prevent high dropout rates which include awareness programmes for School Management Committee members, Mothers' groups and parents of students, rallies and street plays at village level to ensure regular attendance of Out of School Children (OoSC), door to door surveys for identification of OoSC and Adolescent awareness programmes.

Under Samagra Shiksha, financial assistance is provided to States/UTs for undertaking various activities to reduce number of OoSC including opening/upgradation of new schools upto senior secondary level, construction of school buildings & additional classrooms, setting up and running of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBV), setting up of residential schools/hostels, free uniforms, free text books and undertaking enrolment & retention drives. Further, special training for age appropriate admission of out of school children and residential as well as non-residential training for older children, seasonal hostels / residential camps, Special Training Centres at worksites, transport/escort facility are also supported to bring out of school children to the formal schooling system. Under PM-Poshan scheme, hot meal is served to students upto 8<sup>th</sup> standard in all States/UTs.

Further, under the student oriented component for the children with special needs, financial assistance is provided for identification and assessment of children with special needs, aids and appliances, braille kits and books, appropriate teaching learning material, transport and escort facility and stipend to girl students with special needs, etc.
