AMRIT SAROVAR SCHEME IN MADHYA PRADESH

1359 SHRI VISHNU DATT SHARMA:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENTbe pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is implementing AmritSarovar Scheme which aims toconstruct/rejuvenate at least 75 AmritSarovars in each district to overcome the water crisis inrural areas in the country;
- (b) if so, the details of the proposal made and outcomes achieved under the scheme inMadhya Pradesh especially in the districts of Panna, Katni and Chhatarpur of KhajurahoLokSabha region;
- (c) whether the goals of transforming the water landscape, enhancing livelihoods and ensuringwater sustainability are being abided to this scheme;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI KAMLESH PASWAN)

(a)&(b): Mission AmritSarovar was launched on 24th April 2022, with an objective to conserve water for the future. The Mission aimed at developing/rejuvenating 75 AmritSarovar (Pond) in each district of the Country. The target of 50,000 AmritSarovar was achieved on 10th May 2023. The Mission ended on 15th August 2023. As on 26th July 2024, the total number of completed AmritSarovar works is 68,863.

In so far as the State of Madhya Pradesh is concerned, a total of 5,820 AmritSarovars have been constructed, out of which 175 AmritSarovars have been constructed in the districts of Panna, Katni, and Chhatarpur in the KhajurahoLokSabha region. Districtwise details of AmritSarovar completed in State of Madhya Pradesh are given in the Annexure.

(c) to (e): Mapping of Users' group with AmritSarovar was an imperative aspect responsible for the maintenance of AmritSarovar and ensuring its sustainability. So far, more than 60,000 users' formed for AmritSarovars have been constructed/ groups rejuvenated. Sarovars have been identified for different activities such as irrigation, fisheries, Duckery, cultivation of water chestnut and animal husbandry, etc. As of now, 68% of users' groups are engaged in Agriculture, 20.5% in fisheries, 6% are involved in water chestnut & lotus cultivation and 6.5% of groups are involved in Animal husbandry. These activities are being carried out by different user groups which are linked to each AmritSarovar.
