STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 1439 BY SHRI ARUN KUMAR SAGAR TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 31.07.2024 REGARDING LOCO PILOT TRAINING CENTRE AT SHAHJAHANPUR, U.P.

(a) to (c): Indian Railways have a comprehensive training ecosystem, which provides for different sets of training interventions at various stages of career to ensure skilling, reskilling and up-skilling of Railway Employees. To make this possible, elaborate infrastructure has been developed by the Indian Railways in form of training centres across Zonal Railways and Production Units. Within a Zone also, these training centres are spread out across different locations of Divisions or Workshops.

Shajahanpur comes under Moradabad Division of Northern Railway.

There is a Zonal Railway Training Institute functioning at Chandausi under the same Moradabad Division which caters to the training of Assistant Loco Pilots / Loco Pilots. Further, there are two Divisional Permanent Way Training Centres functional at nearby Haridwar and Lucknow where Railway Track Training is imparted.

Besides these, a Divisional Training Centre (Traffic) is functional at Shahjahanpur where training related to Traffic department is imparted.

These training centres are capable to cater to the current training needs. Nevertheless, rationalisation and reorganisation of training centres as per the extent requirement is an ongoing process.
