EMPLOYMENT THROUGH SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRES

143. MS IQRA CHOUDHARY:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state :

- (a) the number of trades in which the Government is currently imparting training to the Youth through Skill Development Centres;
- (b) the total number of youth got employment out of the trained youth in Skill Development Centres across the country during the last three years, State-wise;
- (c) the details of total average monthly income being received by skilled youth in industry or self-employment; and
- (d) the steps to be taken by the Government to provide employment to the youth of Kairana Parliamentary Constituency in the State of Uttar Pradesh through Skill Development Centres?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a to d)Under the Government of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres/colleges/institutes etc. under various schemes, viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Sikhshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country including Kairana Parliamentary Constituency of Uttar Pradesh. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready, equipped with industry relevant skills. The brief of these schemes is as under:

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY): PMKVY Scheme is for imparting skill development training through Short-Term Training (STT) and up-skilling and reskilling through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to youth across the country including rural areas.

Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme: The main target of the JSS is to impart vocational skills to the non-literates, neo-literates and the persons having rudimentary level of education and school dropouts upto 12th standard in the age group of 15-45 years, with due age relaxation in case of "Divyangjan" and other

deserving cases. Priority is given to Women, SC, ST, OBC and Minorities in the rural areas and urban low-income areas.

National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS): This Scheme is for promoting apprenticeship training and increasing the engagement of apprentices by providing financial support for payment of stipend to apprentices. Training consists of Basic Training and On-the-Job Training / Practical Training at workplace in the industry.

Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS): This scheme is for providing long-term training through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) across the country. The ITIs offer a range of vocational/skill training courses covering a large number of economic sectors with an objective to provide skilled workforce to the industry as well as self employment of youth.

The number of trades in which the training is being imparting under above mentioned schemes of MSDE are as under:

PMKVY	Under PMKVY 4.0 scheme there are 796 job-roles/trades in which training is being imparted.		
JSS	28 NSQF aligned courses are being offered under JSS scheme.		
NAPS	Apprenticeship training is being imparted in 265 Designated Trades (DT) and 689 Optional Trades (OT).		
CTS	Craftsman Training is provided in 166 NSQF aligned trades		
CITS	CITS is being offered in 41 trades.		

Placement were tracked in the STT component in the first three versions of the scheme which is PMVY1.0, PMKVY 2.0 and PMKVY 3.0 implemented from FY 2015-16 upto FY 2021-22. State-wise details of candidates reported placed during the last three years (FY 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22) are at **Annexure-I.**

In Kairana Parliamentary Constituency (Saharanpur and Shamli districts) 28,736 number of candidates have been certified and 9,496 number of candidates have been reported placed during PMVY1.0, PMKVY 2.0 and PMKVY 3.0. Monthly income of skilled youth depends upon various factors such as location and sector of employment/self-employment, level of competency acquired, part time or full time work etc. It is, therefore, not possible to indicate a representative monthly income.
