**FOOD PROCESSING FACILITIES**

† **1690. SHRI RAHUL KASWAN:**

Will the Minister of *FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Union Government has received any proposal from the State Governments for setting up of food processing units therein;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise including Rajasthan;
- (c) whether the Government has conducted any study to assess the requirement of food processing facilities in various States including Rajasthan and if so, the details and outcome thereof; and
- (d) the details of the schemes launched by the Government to provide necessary facilities for the development of food processing industries in Rajasthan along with the steps taken / proposed to be taken in this regard?

**ANSWER**

(a) & (b) The Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) has received 58 proposals from various State / UT Governments and their organisations including 2 (Two) proposals from the State Government of Rajasthan and its organisations for setting up of food processing projects under various component schemes of Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY). State/ UT –wise details of the same are at **Annexure**.

(c) The MoFPI has not conducted specific study to assess the requirement of food processing facilities in various States including Rajasthan.

(d) MoFPI has been implementing a Central Sector umbrella scheme – Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY) since 2017-18. The PMKSY is one of the important interventions by the Government in Food Processing sector and it has made substantial contribution in strengthening Food Preservation and Processing Infrastructure of the country. PMKSY is demand driven and it is a comprehensive package of component schemes, which is aimed at creation of modern infrastructure with efficient supply chain management from farm gate to retail outlet. Under the component schemes of PMKSY, viz. Mega Food Parks (discontinued w.e.f. 01.04.2021), Integrated Cold Chain and Value Addition Infrastructure, Creation of Infrastructure for Agro Processing Clusters, Creation/Expansion of Food Processing and Preservation Capacities, Creation of Backward and Forward Linkages (discontinued w.e.f. 01.04.2021) Operation Greens, Food Safety & Quality Assurance Infrastructure – Setting up / Up gradation of Food Testing Laboratories, Human Resource Institutions - Research & Development, financial support in the form of grants-in-aid/ subsidy is being provided for setting

up of food processing projects across the country including the State of Rajasthan to encourage investments in both on-farm and off-farm preservation and processing infrastructure across the country.

MoFPI has been implementing another Central Sector Scheme- viz. Production Linked Incentive Scheme for Food Processing Industry (PLISFPI) scheme, which is aimed at creation of global food manufacturing champions commensurate with the country's natural resource endowment and support Indian brands of food products in the international markets.

MoFPI is also implementing a Centrally Sponsored Scheme- viz. Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) with an objective to enhance competitiveness of existing individual micro-enterprises and promote formalization of the sector. PMFME supports individual enterprises/ FPOs/ SHGs/ Cooperatives along the entire value chain. It also assists in capacity building of entrepreneurs through National Institute of Food Technology Entrepreneurship and Management (NIFTEM). It supports common Infrastructure and Marketing & Branding. The fund-sharing pattern under the scheme is Centre: State 60:40 for States/ UTs with Legislature, 100% Centre share for UTs without Legislature, and Centre: State 90:10 for North Eastern States and Himalayan States. PMFME is being implemented across the country including the State of Rajasthan on One District One Product (ODOP) approach.
