## **EXPENDITURE ON AIRPORT MAINTENANCE WORKS**

(a) the number of airport structural collapses reported since 2014 in the country; and

(b) whether it is true that the spending on routine maintenance work by the Airports Authority of India has gone down to 8.5 per cent in FY-2023 and if so, the reasons therefor?

## ANSWER

(a): During heavy rain, forecourt canopy collapsed at Terminal 1D of Indira Gandhi International Airport, Delhi on 28.06.2024 and kerb area Canopy made of tensile fabric, a non-structural element tore at Jabalpur & Rajkot Airports on 27.06.2024 and 29.06.2024, respectively.

(b): Barring the COVID years, expenditure on repair and maintenance (R&M) has increased. It may be noted that expenditure on repair and maintenance as a percentage of revenue is not an appropriate metric to assess movement of the expenditure over a period of time, since revenue can increase owing to various factors which have no bearing on the R&M expenses.
