Facilities for AYUSH

†1966 Shri Ajay Bhatt:

Will the Minister of AYUSH be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the various components of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme under the National AYUSH Mission to upgrade AYUSH and strengthen its infrastructure;
- (b) whether the Government has allocated adequate funds and created infrastructural facilities for the development of AYUSH across the country, particularly in Uttarakhand;
- (c) if so, the details thereof, during the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise;
- (d) whether the Government has also set up educational institutes under the National AYUSH Mission; and
- (e) if so, the educational institutions set up and planned for education and research under AYUSH in various States of the country including Uttarakhand?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH
(SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)

- (a) Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National Ayush Mission (NAM) there are following provisions to upgrade Ayush and strengthen its infrastructure:
 - (i) Operationalization of Ayush Health & Wellness Centres now renamed as Ayushman Arogya Mandir (Ayush).
 - (ii) Co-location of Ayush facilities at Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs) and District Hospitals (DHs).

- (iii) Upgradation of existing standalone Government Ayush Hospitals.
- (iv) Upgradation of existing Government/Panchayat/Government aided Ayush Dispensaries/
Construction of building for existing Ayush Dispensary (Rented/dilapidated accommodation)/
Construction of building to establish new Ayush Dispensary.
- (v) Setting up of 10/30/50 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals.
- (vi) Infrastructural development of Ayush Under-Graduate Institutions
- (vii) Infrastructural development of Ayush Post-Graduate Institutions/add on PG/Pharmacy/
Para-Medical Courses.
- (viii) Establishment of new Ayush colleges in the States where availability of AYUSH teaching
institutions is inadequate in Government Sector.
- (ix) Supply of essential drugs to Government Ayush Hospitals, Government Dispensaries and
Government/Government aided Teaching Institutional Ayush Hospitals.
- (x) Ayush Public Health Programmes.
- (xi) Behavior Change Communication (BCC).
- (xii) Mobility support at State and District level.
- (xiii) Ayush Gram.

(b) & (c) Public Health being a State Subject, creation of infrastructural facilities comes under the purview of respective State/ UT Governments. Under NAM, as per the proposal received from State/UT Governments through their State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) including Uttarakhand, the details of funds allocated for infrastructural facilities for the development of Ayush across the country during the last three years State/UT-wise is furnished at **Annexure I**. However, during the current financial year as on date, funds could not be released to the State/UT Governments including Uttarakhand due to the non-compliance of issued guidelines of the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance regarding release of grant.

(d & e) Public health being a State subject, setting up of educational institutes comes under the purview of respective State/UT Governments including Uttarakhand. As per the proposals received from State/UT Governments through SAAPs, Ministry has approved 16 New Ayush Educational institutions in various State/UTs of the country including 01 Homoeopathic Medical

College in Dehradun District, Uttarakhand. The details of Ayush Educational Institutions approved under NAM is furnished at **Annexure II**.
