CSR FUNDS USED IN BANSWARA PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCY

QUESTION

2075. SHRI RAJKUMAR ROAT:

Will the Minister of CORPORATE AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details and name of the works in which the amount of CSR funds can be utilised for Local Regional Development and various provisions made in the fund;**
- (b) the details of CSR fund allocated by the Union Government for the scheduled areas during the last five years, year and State-wise; and**
- (c) the year and name-wise details of the works undertaken with the CSR fund in Banswara parliamentary constituency during the last five years?**

ANSWER

(a) : The Government provides the legal framework for Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) through Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act'), Schedule VII of the Act and Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014. Schedule VII of the Act enlists eligible CSR activities which can be undertaken such as eradicating hunger, poverty and malnutrition, promoting health care, provisioning of sanitation and safe drinking water, livelihood enhancement projects, measures for reducing inequalities faced by socially and economically backward groups, training to promote rural sports, etc. Section 135 (5) of the Act provides that the company shall give preference to the local area and areas around where it operates. Further, entries in Schedule VII are broad-based and must be interpreted liberally so as to capture the essence of the subjects enumerated therein.

(b) & (c) : There is no such provision of allocation of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds by the Union Government under CSR legal framework. Under the Act, CSR is a Board driven process and the Board of the company is empowered to plan, decide, execute and monitor CSR activities based on the recommendations of its CSR Committee. The Board of the Company constitutes the CSR Committee and taking into account of the recommendations made by the CSR Committee, approves the CSR Policy for the company. The CSR is disclosure based and CSR mandated companies are required to file details of CSR activities annually in the MCA21 registry. All data related to CSR filed by companies in

MCA21 registry including company-wise, state-wise, district-wise and development sector-wise is available at public domain at www.csr.gov.in. Further, the Ministry does not maintain scheduled area-wise and Parliamentary constituency-wise details of CSR spent.

However, on the basis of annual filings made by Companies in the MCA21 registry, the details of district-wise CSR spent in Aspirational Districts (as certain districts have been identified by the NITI Aayog as 'Aspirational Districts) and the development sector-wise CSR spent in Banswara district during the last five financial years (FY) i.e 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 & 2022-23 are attached as Annexure-I & Annexure-II respectively.
