Modernization of Madarsas in Bihar

2300 Dr. Mohammad Jawed:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of madarsas that have been modernized in Bihar especially in Kishanganj district;
- (b) the total funds allocated and disbursed to madarsas in Bihar especially in Kishanganj district; and
- (c) the number of teachers trained under modern educational methods in Bihar especially in Kishanganj district?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) Based on the information received from the State Government of Bihar, the Department of Minority Welfare, Bihar introduced a programme called Talim-i-Naubalighan to strengthen the Government aided/affiliated madarsas of Bihar. This programme aims to elevate the systems of madarsas to the standards of other educational institutions. The programme has engaged with 1921 madarsas of Bihar including 336 madarsas of Kishanganj district.

Besides, under the Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasas (SPQEM) implemented by the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India, a total of 1127 aided madarsas running in different districts of Bihar including 241 madarsas of Kishanganj district have been provided one set of computer with printer.

A total fund of Rs. 20 crore has been allocated by the Minority Welfare Department, State Government of Bihar for 1921 madarsas of Bihar including 336 madarsas of Kishanganj district.

A total of 3628 teachers and 1832 Principals have been trained under modern Education method in Bihar including 533 teachers and 323 Principals in Kishanganj district.
