JJM IN RAJASTHAN

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the amount of funds sanctioned under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) in the State of Rajasthan during the last five years, district-wise and year-wise;
- (b) the number of households covered/proposed to be covered under JJM in the same State particularly in Dungarpur-Banswara districts; and
- (c) the time by which the remaining households are proposed to be covered under the said scheme?

ANSWER

- (a) Since August, 2019, Government of India is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), in partnership with States, to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household of the country, including in Rajasthan. Under JJM, funds are released directly to the States/ UTs and their further district-wise allocations are made and maintained by respective States/ UTs only and not at the Government of India level. As such, the funds allocated to state government of Rajasthan during last five years 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 are Rs.1,301.71 crore, Rs.2,522.03 crore, Rs.10,180.50 crore, Rs.13,328.60 crore and Rs.3,019.94 crore respectively.
- (b) JJM follows a universal saturation approach and covers all rural households in the country including those in Dungarpur and Banswara districts of Rajasthan. As reported by the state Government of Rajasthan, at the time of launch of Jal Jeevan Mission in the State on 15.08.2019, approximately 11.68 lakh rural households had tap water connections. Since then, 43.99 lakh additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections. Thus, as on 05.08.2024, the provision of tap water supply is available to more than 55.68 lakh (51.99%) rural households in Rajasthan. The details of the rural households covered and balance households to be covered under JJM, district-wise including in Dungarpur and Banswara districts are annexed.
- (c) The State Government of Rajasthan has said that it will saturate all eligible rural households with tap water connections by December 2026.
