Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is true that the cut-off for admissions to MD/MS medical courses has fallen to as low as zero percentile during the last few years and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether this implies that candidates with negative marks in NEET-PG are also eligible for admission to post-graduate medical courses and if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) whether the Government is considering any amendments to this policy and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a) to (c): The cut-off/qualifying percentile for admissions to MD/MS medical courses was lowered to the minimum for all categories for the academic year 2023-24 to ensure that no PG seats remained unutilized. All candidates who appeared in the NEET-PG 2023 exam were eligible to participate in the admission and counseling process for postgraduate medical courses for the academic year 2023-24.
