Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the funds allocated, released and utilized under Har Ghar Nal Se Jal Yojana (HGNSJY) during the years 2023-24 and 2024-25, year and State-wise including Uttar Pradesh and Haryana particularly in Sonipat Lok Sabha Constituency;
- (b) the details of the targets fixed and the number of rural families benefitted during the said period; and
- (c) the details of the target set and the number of families proposed to be covered under the said scheme during the current financial year and the next year, i.e. 2025-26, State and district-wise?

- (a) to (c) A statement is laid on the table of the House.

Statement referred to in reply of Lok Sabha Starred Question No. 154 for reply on 05/12/2024

(a) Government of India in partnership with States, is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) – Har Ghar Jal to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household. The year-wise and State/ UT-wise details, including those of Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, of fund allocated, released and utilized under JJM during 2023-24 and 2024-25 is at **Annex-I**. However, Water being a State subject, district-wise/ constituency-wise fund allocations and details thereof are not made and maintained by this department.

(b) & (c) At the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, 3.23 Crore (17%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections. All the remaining rural households at the time of launch of the Mission were planned for providing tap water connection. As reported by States/ UTs, 8.39 Crore rural households were provided with tap water connections till 2022-23. About 3 crore connections were provided in 2023-24, and 69.46 lakh in 2024-25 (as on 29.11.2024). Thus, as on 29.11.2024, out of 19.34 Crore rural households in the country, more than 15.32 Crore (79.17%) households were reported to have tap water supply in their homes and the remaining households are likely to be covered by the States as per their plans.

State/ UT wise details of remaining rural households at the start of Mission and households provided with tap water connections till 2022-23, in 2023-24 and in 2024-25 till 29.11.2024 are at **Annex-II**. Further, the district-wise status of tap water connection provided under the Mission in rural areas is also in public domain and available on JJM dashboard at:
