(a) whether the Government proposes to expand through effective use of BharatNet enabled connectivity to transform 2.5 lakh villages into digital villages;

(b) if so, the number of villages targeted to be covered in Maharashtra district-wise;

(c) the length of Optical Fiber Cable (OFC) in kilometer laid in the rural areas of Maharashtra so far; and

(d) the details of the number of Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) connections commissioned along with the number of Wi-Fi hotspots set up to ensure last-mile connectivity district-wise?

# MINISTER OF STATE FOR COMMUNICATIONS AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (DR. PEMMASANI CHANDRA SEKHAR)

(a) BharatNet project is being implemented in a phased manner to provide broadband connectivity to all the Gram Panchayats (GPs) (around 2.65 lakh) of the country, including 27,939 GPs in Maharashtra.

(b) to (d) The Optical Fiber Cable (OFC) laid under BharatNet in Maharashtra is 85,290 km, till October end, 2024. The details of district-wise number of GPs made service ready and Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) connections commissioned under BharatNet in Maharashtra are available on Digital Bharat Nidhi website (<u>https://usof.gov.in/</u>). Total Wi-Fi hotspots installed under BharatNet in the state is 12,054 GPs.
