SALIENT FEATURES OF SBM-U

Will the Minister for HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features of Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U);**
- (b) the details of the funds allocated and utilised under the said Mission in the States of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh during the last five years;**
- (c) the details of the targets set and achievements made so far under the said mission in the said States;**
- (d) whether the Government has fixed any target to set up waste processing plants under the said mission across the country; and**
- (e) if so, the details thereof, State-wise including Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra particularly of Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar (Aurangabad) along with the status of such plants thereof?**

ANSWER

(a) : Government of India launched the Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban (SBM-U) on October 2, 2014 with the objective of Open Defecation Free (ODF) and for scientific processing of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) generated in the urban areas of the country. To carry forward the progress made, SBM – Urban 2.0 was launched on 1st October, 2021 with the vision to achieve “Garbage Free” status through 100% source segregation, door-to-door collection and scientific processing of all fraction of waste, safe disposal in scientific landfill, remediation of all legacy dumpsites by converting into green zones and treatment of used water including faecal sludge for Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) under 1 lakh population to ensure that no untreated water pollutes the ground water or water bodies.

(b) : Under SBM-U and SBM-U 2.0, Central Share (CS) of funds are allocated to States/UTs for the entire mission period and not on yearly basis. The details of funds allocated and utilized/claimed by the States of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh during the last five years under SBM-U and SBM-U 2.0 is given below:

(d) &(e) : To carry forward the progress made SBM-U, the next phase i.e. Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM-U) 2.0 was launched on October 1st, 2021 for a period of five years with a vision of achieving safe sanitation and scientific processing of municipal solid waste in all cities. To achieve the target of SBM-U 2.0 by Oct. 2026, Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs (MoHUA) supplements the efforts of States/UTs by providing policy directions, financial and technical support. As reported by States/UTs on Swachhattam portal, a total of 1,61,910 ton per day (TPD) of Municipal Solid Waste is generated in the urban areas of the country. Out of which 1,29,949 TPD is processed. i.e. against 16% waste processing in 2014, the current processing capacity has increased to 80.26%.
