SETTING UP OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS IN BACKWARD AND NEEDY AREAS

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has recently reviewed the functioning of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and its outcome;
- (c) the location-wise number of Kendriya Vidyalayas set up in various States of the country including Maharashtra during the last three years and the current year;
- (d) the location-wise details of the Kendriya Vidyalayas to be set up in the remaining period of the current plan; and
- (e) the measures being taken/to be taken by the Government for setting up Kendriya Vidyalayas in backward and needy areas of the country particularly in Maharashtra, district-wise?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a) & (b) The functioning of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) is regularly reviewed and monitored by the Ministry of Education. The performance of the organization is periodically appraised by the Board of Governors and the General Body of the KVS. Annual action plan and medium terms strategic plans are drawn up along with key result areas for monitoring the performance. The performance of KVS is also reported to the Parliament through its Annual reports and Audited statements of accounts every year.

(c) to (e) As per information received from KVS, 14 new Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) under Civil / Defence / Institute of Higher Learning / Project Sector, have been opened throughout the country during the last three years and current year (i.e. 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 and current year 2024-25). State / UT-wise details are annexed.

At present, 59 KVs are functioning in the State of Maharashtra. Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per extant procedures. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority as per extant procedures. KVs are not opened on the criteria of backward / needy areas.
