SOLAR ENERGY POLICY

308. SHRI. DAMODAR AGRAWAL

Will the Minister of NEW AND RENEWABLE ENERGY be pleased to state:

- (a) the details and the salient features of solar energy policy of the Government;
- (b) the implementation status of the said policy in State of Rajasthan, district-wise particularly in Bhilwara Parliamentary Constituency;
- (c) the details of the ongoing schemes to promote the use of solar energy at domestic level;
- (d) whether the Government extends financial assistance for setting up small rooftop solar systems for domestic use in the State of Rajasthan; and
- (e) If so, the details thereof, district-wise including Bhilwara Parliamentary constituency?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR NEW & RENEWABLE ENERGY AND POWER

(SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

(a) to (c) In order to promote development of solar energy in the country, the National Solar Mission (NSM) was launched in January 2010 under which the Government has introduced various schemes from time to time. The list of operational schemes is given at **Annexure-I**. As on 31.10.2024, around 24.55 GW of solar energy capacity has been installed in the state of Rajasthan, including Bhilwara Parliamentary Constituency.

(d) & (e) The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana (PM-SGMBY) aims to facilitate the installation of rooftop solar systems (RTS) in one crore households across India.

The scheme has an overall outlay of Rs. 75,021 crore and is to be implemented till FY 2026-27 for installation of rooftop solar systems (RTS) across India, including in the state of Rajasthan.

As of November 21, 2024, district wise details of Central Financial Assistance (CFA) disbursed in various districts of Rajasthan under the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana are given at **Annexure -II**.

1. Solar Park Scheme for setting up of at least 50 Solar Parks targeting 40,000 MW of solar power projects.
2. Scheme for setting up 12,000 MW of Grid-Connected Solar PV Power Projects by the Government producers with Viability Gap Funding (VGF).
3. Pradhan Mantri Kisan Urja Suraksha evam Utthaan Mahabhiyan (PM-KUSUM).
4. PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana to install one crore rooftop solar systems in the residential sector.
5. New Solar Power Scheme (for Tribal and PVTG Habitations/Villages) under Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN) and Dharti Abha Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan (DA JGUA).
6. Production-linked incentive scheme under “National Programme on high efficiency Solar PV Modules.”
7. Green Energy Corridor Scheme for Intra-State Transmission System.
