3532. SHRI PRADEEP KUMAR SINGH: SHRI CHANDRA PRAKASH CHOUDHARY: SHRI NALIN SOREN: SHRI GOPAL JEE THAKUR:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENTbe pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is implementing Mission AmritSarovar which aims to develop/rejuvenate AmritSarovars in each district to conserve water and to overcome water crisis in the rural areas of the country;
- (b) whether new ponds are likely to be dug and old ponds are timely repaired under the said mission;
- (c) if so, the details of proposals submitted and results achieved under the said mission in districts of Jharkhand and Bihar including Darbhanga Parliamentary Constituency, State/Districtwise; and
- (d) the district-wise, allocated fund-wise and expenditure-wise details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI KAMLESH PASWAN)

(a)&(b): Mission AmritSarovar was launched by the Honorable Prime Minister on April 24th, 2022, to construct or rejuvenate 75 AmritSarovars in every rural district (except Delhi, Chandigarh, and Lakshadweep) with initial target of 50,000 sarovars across the country by 15th August 2023, in a concerted effort to conserve water for future generations. As on October 2024, the construction/rejuvenation of over 68,000 AmritSarovar has been completed under the Mission.

Under phase II of the mission, the aim is to construct or rejuvenate more Sarovars with the focus on community engagement to ensure that these Sarovars not only serve as sustainable water resources but also become vibrant community hubs.

(c)&(d): As on 12.12.2024, a total number of 2,048 AmritSarovars have been constructed/rejuvenated in the State of Jharkhand. District-wise details are given in Annexure-I.

As on 12.12.2024, a total number of 2,482 AmritSarovars have been constructed/rejuvenated in the State of Bihar, out of which 51 AmritSarovars have been constructed/rejuvenated in Darbhanga district. Details of district-wise Sarovars completed in Bihar are given in Annexure-II.

The Mission AmritSarovar works are taken up by the States and Districts under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (Mahatma Gandhi NREGS) in convergence with various ongoing schemes and programmes such as the 15th Finance Commission Grants, Pradhan MantriKrishiSinchayiYojna subschemes of Watershed Development, HarKhetkoPani and the States' own schemes. Public contribution through crowd-funding and use of Corporate Social Responsibility fund is also allowed for the same.
