**NULM AND SJRY**

**NO. 628. SHRI SANJAY HARIBHAU JADHAV:**

**Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:**

- (a) the year when the National Urban Livelihood Mission (NULM) and Swarn Jayanti Shahari Rojgar Yojana (SJRJ) were launched in the country;**
- (b) whether the purpose of both the above schemes is to create opportunities for skill development among the poor residing in the Urban areas by mobilising them and if so, the details thereof;**
- (c) the number of districts in the State of Maharashtra including Parbhani Parliamentary Constituency where the people have been benefitted with these schemes during the last five years;**
- (d) the impact of the benefits of these schemes on the lives of the people;**
- (e) whether job opportunities have been generated under both the schemes, if so, the details thereof; and**
- (f) the other steps taken/being taken by the Government to improve the living standards of the people and to make it beneficial?**

**ANSWER**

- (a) & (b): Urban development, including urban poverty alleviation is a state subject and the implementation of schemes/programmes under this is the responsibility of State/UT Governments. Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs (MoHUA) supplements the effort of State/UT by providing Central Assistance under “Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM)”.**

**The Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY), was launched in 1997 and implemented till 2013, had aimed at providing gainful employment to the urban unemployed and underemployed through setting up of self-employment ventures or provision of wage employment. On 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2013, SJSRY was restructured and launched as National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM). In February, 2016 the Mission was renamed as Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Urban Livelihoods Mission and extended to all the statutory towns in the country.**

**The “Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM)” has the objective of reducing poverty and vulnerability of urban poor households by enabling them to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, in order to improve their livelihoods on a sustainable basis, through building strong grassroots level institutions of the urban poor.**

- (c): DAY-NULM has been implemented in all 35 districts of Maharashtra including Parbhani Lok Sabha Constituency. Parbhani Constituency is made up of Parbhani District and part of Jalna District. During last five years there have been a total of 1,16,088 beneficiaries from the State of Maharashtra including 4209 beneficiaries from the Parbhani District who have been provided with skill training benefits.**
- (d) to (f): NULM & SJSRY, both schemes created the opportunities for skill development among the poor residing in the Urban areas. As SJSRY was till 2013, Under NULM opportunities created for urban poor by mobilizing them to make a Self Help Group. To provide employment/self-employment opportunities to the urban poor beneficiaries under Social Mobilisation and Institution Development (SM&ID), Self-Employment Programme (SEP) and Support to Urban Street Vendors (SUSV) components of DAY-NULM. Total 24,93,189 job opportunities have been generated by DAY-NULM including 1,16,088 job opportunities in State of Maharashtra.**
