Will the **Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the amount of funds allocated and spent under the Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) since its inception till February, 2025, State-wise including Assam, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Maharashtra and particularly in BhiwaniMahendergarh Parliamentary Constituency of Haryana;
- (b) the timeline fixed for the implementation of the said Mission across the country, State-wise including Maharashtra;
- (c) the total number of Ayushman Bharat Health Accounts (ABHA) created and healthcare professionals registered on the Healthcare Professional Registry (HPR) portal and health facilities enrolled under the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) in the country as on February 2025, State-wise and district-wise including Bengaluru in Karnataka, particularly in Mahasamund, Dhamtari and Gariaband districts of Chhattisgarh and in Bhiwani-Mahendergarh Parliamentary Constituency of Haryana;
- (d) whether the Government has taken any steps to develop/strengthen the health infrastructure in the country to deal with possible pandemic in future and if so, the details thereof, State-wise particularly in Maharashtra;
- (e) the manner in which these measures taken/being taken by the Government is likely to enhance the preparedness for future health crisis in the country particularly in Maharashtra;
- (f) the steps being taken to ensure the accessibility of the said mission to improve healthcare facilities in rural and remote/underdeveloped regions of the country particularly in Maharashtra; and
- (g) the challenges faced in implementing the Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission and the steps being taken to address them?

**STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA
STARRED QUESTION NO. 492 FOR 4TH APRIL, 2025**

(a) & (b) Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) with some Central Sector Components (CS) which has an outlay of Rs. 64,180 Crores for the **scheme period (2021-22 to 2025-26)**. It was launched by the Government of India to strengthen the health infrastructure in the country and to deal with possible pandemic in the future.

Under the CSS component of the scheme, administrative approvals have been accorded to States/UTs for FY 2021-22 to 2024-25 for an amount of **Rs 20451.31 Crore**. The details of support provided along with approval accorded to the States/UTs, across all the component under CSS component of PM-ABHIM for four years (i.e. FY 2021-22 to 2024-25) is at **Annexure-I**

In Bhiwani and Mahendergarh district of Haryana, approval has been accorded for one 50 bedded Critical Care Blocks (amounting to Rs.23.75 Cr.) and one Integrated Public Health Lab (amounting to Rs.1.25 Crore) in each district.

The State/UT -wise central releases and expenditure incurred under Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) component of PM - Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) since its inception till February, 2025 is as **Annexure - II**

(c) **Ayushman Bharat Health Accounts (ABHA)** - The total number of ABHA created, healthcare professionals registered on the Healthcare Professional Registry (HPR) portal and health facilities enrolled under the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) in the country as on 28th February 2025 is as per **Annexure - III**

(d) to (f) Under the CSS component of the scheme provision is made to strengthen healthcare infrastructure across the country, particularly in rural and underserved areas. The component of the scheme are establishment of **17,788 building-less Sub-Centres - Ayushman Arogya Mandir (AAM)** to ensure accessible of healthcare services at the grassroots level, establishment of **11,024 AAM in urban areas** with a special focus on serving slums and urban areas, establishment of **3,382 Block Public Health Units (BPHUs)** to provide essential health services at the block level. To strengthen the diagnostic services, provision is made for establishment of **730 Integrated Public Health Labs (IPHLs)**.

Furthermore, **602 Critical Care Blocks (CCBs)** are provisioned for districts with populations exceeding 5 lakhs, ensuring better emergency and intensive care services.

Under the CS component of the scheme, major provisions are Establishment of 150 bedded Critical Care Blocks in Central Hospitals, Metropolitan Surveillance Units (MSU), Biosafety Level 3 (BSL-3) Laboratories, National Centre for Disease Control (NCDCs) State and Regional Branches, Health emergency Operation Centres (HEOC) and Integrated Health Information Portal (IHIP) portal for surveillance.

Under the CSS component of PM-ABHIM , provision is made for the State of Maharashtra for establishment of 36 Integrated Public Health Labs and 36 Critical Care Blocks with an amount of Rs.1077.53 Crore. This strategic investment will significantly enhance the accessibility of crucial diagnostic and emergency care services, particularly in rural and remote areas. The implementation of these facilities will support Maharashtra's preparedness and response capabilities during pandemics and other public health emergencies

(g) Health and hospital are state subjects, the responsibility of the implementation of the schemes lies with the State Government. Further, PM-ABHIM is an infrastructural development scheme aimed at strengthening public health facilities and has high gestation period for groundwork. It has been reported by the State that factors such as site selection, identification of implementing agencies, preparation of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs), and the tendering and awarding of contracts requires extended time.

To ensure the effective implementation of the scheme, support has been provisioned to establish Project Management Unit in the States/UTs to provide adequate support and coordination. Further, regular meetings and conferences are held to review the progress. The updated progress of the scheme is also monitored through Progress Monitoring System dashboard.
