Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) takes up conservation and preservation of centrally protected monuments/sites as per National Conservation Policy, 2014 and provisions of Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1958 (AMASR Act, 1958).
- (b) ASI takes up conservation, preservation and maintenance of 3,698 centrally protected monuments/sites in the country as per requirement and availability of resources.
