Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the manner in which inclusivity is ensured in the mission to include women farmers, Sharecroppers and informal land holders in digitisation process;
- (b) the provisions made to provide support to the farmers in the areas having poor internet reach or digital infrastructure;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to increase the budget on the basis of progress of the mission and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the details of the number of farmers covered under this mission, State and district-wise particularly Sidhi Parliamentary Constituency of Madhya Pradesh?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE

- (a): The State Farmer Registry under the Digital Agriculture Mission covers all the land holders' farmers, including women farmers. Farmers Registry application also has the provision to onboard the tenant and lessee farmers. A State can decide to include such farmers in the Farmers Registry as per the state's policy.
- (b) & (c): The Government has approved the Digital Agriculture Mission with an outlay of Rs. 2817 Crore. The Mission seeks to enable a robust digital agriculture ecosystem in the country for driving innovative farmer-centric digital solutions and making available timely and reliable crop-related information to all the farmers in the country. The Mission envisages the creation of Digital Public Infrastructure for Agriculture such as Agristack, Krishi Decision Support System, Comprehensive Soil Fertility & Profile Map and other IT initiatives undertaken by Central Government/State Governments. The Government is providing administrative and technical supports to the all the states for implementation of the Mission.
- (d): As on 07.02.2025, a total of 2,05,26,912 farmer IDs have been created which includes 41,87,528 from state of Madhya Pradesh. Out of this approximately 70539 Farmers Ids have been created in Sidhi Districts of Madhya Pradesh. Details of the Farmer Ids created in the states is given at Annexure –I. Further, District-wise details for the State of Madhya Pradesh is given at Annexure-II.
