Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री
be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the Government has plan to promote value addition and develop Jalgaon Lok Sabha in Maharashtra into a hub for textile industries;
- (b) whether the Government has any plan to ensure uniform development standards across Greenfield and Brownfield textile parks including potential sites in Maharashtra;
- (c) the types of industries (spinning, weaving, garments, etc.) expected to dominate the textile parks, considering the MoUs signed for an investment potential of Rs. 18,500 crore;
- (d) whether the Government has plans to establish training institutes or skill development centres within the parks to support a skilled workforce in regions like Jalgaon; and
- (e) If so, the details of these training initiatives and the manner in which these will be implemented to benefit the country including Maharashtra?

(a) to (e): With a view to develop integrated large scale and modern industrial infrastructure facility for entire value-chain of the textile industry, the Government has approved setting up of 7 (Seven) PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA) Parks in Greenfield/Brownfield sites with scheme outlay of Rs. 4,445 crore for the period 2021-22 to 2027-28. The Government has finalised 7 sites including one in Amravati Maharashtra for setting up PM MITRA Parks.

To ensure uniform development standards the following norms have been prescribed for land development patterns in the park:

- (i) 50% area for Manufacturing Zone – caters to the entire value chain from spinning to RMG / Anchor and ancillary units, including plug and play,
- (ii) 20% area for common utilities and infrastructure – Roads, CETP, STP, WTP, Sub-station, Boiler units etc
- (iii) 10% area for subsidised housing and associated social infrastructure such as schools / hospitals etc
- (iv) 10% area for commercial use for hotels, exhibition, convention centres, offices and related uses
- (v) 5% area for specialised and value additive activities such as Testing Labs, Training Centre, R&D Centre, Incubation Labs, Start Ups, Centres of Excellence
- (vi) 5% area for logistics zone - multi-modal linkages, bonded areas for seamless transport and storage

So far, investment MoUs with an expected investment potential of over Rs. 18,500 crore have been signed under the PM MITRA Park scheme including MoUs worth Rs. 1,370 crore for PM MITRA Park Amravati. These investment proposals span various segments of textile value chain e.g. Polyester, cotton spinning yarn, Plastic Masterbatches, Cotton yarn/denim fabrics, terry towel, spinning and yarn, etc.

No proposal for setting up of Textile Park in Jalgaon is pending in the Ministry.

The Ministry is implementing (SAMARTH)- Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SCBTS), with the objective to provide demand driven, placement oriented National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) compliant skilling programmes to incentivize and supplement the efforts to the industry in creating jobs in the organized textile (excluding spinning & weaving) and related sectors and to provide skilling and skill-upgradation in the traditional sectors. As on 03.02.2025, a total of 3,57,949 beneficiaries have been trained (passed) and 2,86,206 beneficiaries have been placed under “SAMARTH”.
