Status of Tea Gardens in India

1319. SHRI MANOJ TIGGA:

Will the Minister of **COMMERCE & INDUSTRY** (वाणिज्य एवं उद्योग मंत्री) be pleased to state:

(a) the details and the total number of Tea Gardens in the country, State-wise;

(b) the total number of tea gardens currently operational in the country, State-wise;

(c) the number of sick or weak Tea Gardens in the country, State-wise;

(d) the details and the number of tea gardens in the country classified as sick or weak, Statewise;

(e) the number of closed Tea Gardens in the country, State-wise;

(f) the details and total number of tea gardens closed in the country during the last ten years, State-wise;

(g) the details of Government initiatives for closed, sick or weak Tea Gardens, State-wise; and

(h) the details of outline the initiatives and steps taken by the Government to uplift, revive and support closed, sick or weak tea gardens in the country, State-wise?

(a) & (b) The details of total tea gardens and the gardens currently operational in the country (state-wise) are attached as Annexure-I.

(c) & (d) There is no specific definition for sick tea gardens as per Tea Act, 1953. A Garden is considered closed by the Tea Board on the basis of the report received from the concerned State Government.

(e) Currently, there are 16 closed tea gardens (13 in West Bengal and 3 in Kerala) in the country.

(f) The details of closed tea gardens in the country during last ten years (state-wise) are attached as Annexure-II.

(g) & (h) The major reasons for the closure of gardens are low productivity and workers issues. While the workers issues are under the purview of concerned State Governments, the Central Government through Tea Board implements the scheme 'Tea Development & Promotion Scheme' with the objective which *inter alia* include increasing productivity & quality of tea and welfare measures, under which there are provisions for providing book and uniform grants to the wards of workers of closed teaestates & gardens affected by natural calamities and assistance for disabled and critically ill dependants of workers (kidney, heart, liver diseases and cancer) in closed tea gardens.
