1646. Shri Omprakash Bhupalsinh Alias Pavan Rajenimbalkar: Shri Narayan Tatu Rane: Shri Sanjay Uttamrao Deshmukh:

Will the Minister of CORPORATE AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of organizations working in social sectors such as environment, skill development, water and sanitation through Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in the country, State-wise;
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned/allocated by the said organisations/NGOs in the country particularly in Osmanabad, Ratnagiri-Sindhudurg and Yavatmal-Washim Parliamentary Constituencies in Maharashtra during the last five years;
- (c) the details of funds utilised in Maharashtra by these NGOs along with the amount of funds released to these NGOs under CSR during the last five years, district-wise and year-wise;
- (d) the names of NGOs working along with the details of works done by the said organisations and NGOs under CSR, particularly in the aspirational districts of Osmanabad, Ratnagiri-Sindhudurg and Yavatmal-Washim Parliamentary Constituencies in Maharashtra; and
- (e) the specific steps taken by the Government for improvement in it?

ANSWER

(a) : The organization-wise details of CSR expenditure is not maintained by the Ministry. However, on the basis of the filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, the development sector-wise details of CSR expenditure including social sectors such as environment, skill development, water and sanitation, State/UT-wise and Year-wise along with number of companies for last five financial years (FYs) i.e 2018-19 to 2022-23 are at Annexure-I, Annexure-II & Annexure-III respectively.

(b): There is no provision of sanction/allocation of CSR fund under CSR legal framework. However, on the basis of the filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, the district-wise details of CSR expenditure in Maharashtra for last five financial years (FYs) i.e 2018-19 to 2022-23 is at Annexure-III.

(c) & (d): Under Section 135 of the Act read with Rule 4(1) of the Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014 prescribes that the Board of the company is empowered to undertake its CSR activities either by itself or through-

- i. a company established under section 8 of the Act, or a registered public trust or a registered society, exempted under sub-clauses (iv), (v), (vi) or (via) of clause (23C) of section 10 or registered under section 12A and approved under 80 G of the Income Tax Act, 1961 (43 of 1961), established by the company, either singly or along with any other company; or
- ii. a company established under section 8 of the Act or a registered trust or a registered society, established by the Central Government or State Government; or
- iii. any entity established under an Act of Parliament or a State legislature; or
- a company established under section 8 of the Act, or a registered public trust or a registered society, exempted under sub-clauses (iv), (v), (vi) or (via) of clause (23C) of section 10 or registered under section 12A and approved under 80 G of the Income Tax Act, 1961, and having an established track record of at least three years in undertaking similar activities.

Further, the companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014 was amended on 22nd January, 2021 and registration of above Implementing Agencies with the Central Government has been made mandatory with effect from 1st April, 2021. As on date total number of 87578 implementing agencies have registered with MCA21 registry. State/UT-wise data of the implementing agencies is not maintained by Ministry.

The Ministry does not maintain the Parliamentary Constituency-wise and Implementing Agency-wise CSR expenditure data. Further, the Year-wise and districtwise CSR expenditure in Maharashtra are included in Annexure IV.

On the basis of the filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, the aspirational district-wise details of CSR expenditure in Maharashtra for last five financial years (FYs) i.e 2018-19 to 2022-23 is at Annexure-V.

(e): As per the extant CSR legal framework, the CSR provisions are applicable across areas or regions including socially, economically and educationally backward areas of the country. Similarly, Schedule VII of the Act enlists the eligible CSR activities. As per Schedule VII, activities such as eradicating hunger, poverty and malnutrition, promoting health care, provisioning of sanitation and safe drinking water, livelihood enhancement projects, measures for reducing inequalities faced by socially and economically backward groups, training to promote rural sports etc. are considered as eligible CSR activities. The board of CSR mandated companies may undertake any activity as specified under schedule VII of the Act subject to fulfilment of companies (CSR Policy) Rules 2014.
