MAINTENANCE AND BEAUTIFICATION OF ANCIENT HERITAGES IN RAJASTHAN

Will the Minister of CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of schemes being implemented by the Central Government for the maintenance of ancient monuments in the State of Rajasthan particularly in the district of Udaipur division;
- (b) the details of the expenditure incurred on the maintenance of each monuments in the State during the last five years;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to take any special step for the maintenance and beautification of famous ancient heritages of the districts of Udaipur division; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF CULTURE AND TOURISM (SHRI GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT)

(a) There is no such scheme under consideration. However, Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) takes up conservation and maintenance work of protected monuments and sites throughout the country regularly as per the need of monuments and availability of resources. The facilities being provided in these monuments/sites are drinking water, toilet, pathways etc. Out of 163 monuments/sites in the state of Rajasthan, 30 monuments/sites are in the districts of Udaipur division. The list of monuments/sites in the districts of Udaipur division is attached as Annexure - I.

(b) The details of expenditure incurred on the conservation and maintenance of protected monuments and archaeological sites in the Rajasthan during the last five years are as under:
