#### **FEATURES OF DAY-NRLM**

### 1986. SMT. DELKAR KALABEN MOHANBHAI:

### Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the features of DeendayalAntyodayaYojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM);
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized under the said scheme, State-wise including Dadra and Nagar Haveli during the last three years and the current year;
- (c) the details of number of women included in Self Help Groups (SHGs) under the said scheme, State-wise particularly in Dadra and Nagar Haveli;
- (d) whether the Government has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Ministry of New and Renewable Energy to facilitate green mobility for women of SHGs and DAY-NRLM;
- (e) if so, the details thereof, State-wise including Dadra and Nagar Haveli; and
- (f) the steps being taken by the Government to reach the last person to eradicate poverty under this scheme?

#### **ANSWER**

### MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (DR. CHANDRA SEKHAR PEMMASANI)

(a): DeendayalAntyodayaYojana- National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) is a flagship poverty alleviation program of the Government of India and is one of the world's largest initiatives to improve the livelihoods of the poor. The Mission seeks to achieve its objective through investing in four key features viz., (a) social mobilization, promotion and strengthening of self-managed and financially sustainable community institutions of the rural poor; (b)

financial inclusion of the rural poor; (c) sustainable livelihoods; and (d) social inclusion, social development and convergence.

Through these features, it seeks to improve the living standards of rural population, particularly women, by fostering sustainable livelihood opportunities through capacity building, financial inclusion, and social empowerment. It plays a critical role in transforming rural communities into self-reliant and economically vibrant units.

- (b): the details of funds sanctioned/allocated and utilized under the said scheme, State-wise including Dadra and Nagar Haveli during the last three years and the current year are given at Annexure-I.
- (c): the details of number of women included in Self Help Groups (SHGs) under DAY-NRLM scheme, State-wise including in Dadra and Nagar Haveli is given at Annexure-II.
- (d) &(e): No.
- (f): DAY NRLM adopts a saturation approach where efforts are made to bring all eligible poor households under the fold of SHGs, link them to finance and promote diversified and sustainable livelihoods. Social inclusion is one of the key focus areas where the most vulnerable population including persons with disabilities, transgenders and marginalised communities are mobilised under DAY-NRLM.

In addition to economic empowerment, attempts have also been made to address the issues of social and political empowerment at the grass-root level. This includes social and behavioural change communication strategies for improving awareness around food, nutrition, health, WASH and gender issues. Continuous efforts are made to forge convergence of the SHGs and their federation with the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI) so that these poor households have access to rights and entitlements and are a part of decentralised planning process.
