Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government plans to extend the Aspirational Block Scheme (ABS) to more blocks across the country;
- (b) if so, the details of the extension plan, including the number of blocks to be added, timeline and financial allocation:
- (c) whether the Government has considered to include climate change and environmental vulnerability as criteria for the selection of aspirational blocks under the scheme;
- (d) if so, the parameters proposed to assess climate risks such as vulnerability to extreme weather events, availability of water resources, deforestation and loss of biodiversity;
- (e) the steps being taken to promote climate-resilient infrastructure, green energy and sustainable agricultural practices in aspirational blocks;
- (f) whether the Government is collaborating with the State Governments, international agencies or research institutions to incorporate climate adaptation and mitigation measures in the scheme; and
- (g) if so, the details of the pilot initiatives, if any?

(a) and (b) The Aspirational Blocks Programme covers 500 blocks across India. Currently, the program is limited to 500 Blocks only.

- (c) and (d) The aspirational blocks were selected through a transparent process on the basis of published data. List of indicators and the weight attached to them for selection of the blocks is attached in Annexure I.
- (e), (f) and (g) The Aspirational Blocks Programme is essentially a template for improving governance. The programme monitors all Aspirational Blocks on a quarterly basis across 40 key performance indicators. These indicators fall under crucial sectors of Health & Nutrition, Education, Agriculture & Allied Sectors, Social Development, and Basic Infrastructure. The Programme aims at rapid transformation of relatively underdeveloped Blocks. It is envisaged that an improvement in the indicators under focus in this programme will result in improvement in the quality of life of citizens.
