SCHEME FOR SPECIAL ASSISTANCE TO SCEI

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government had launched a new scheme called Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure/Investment;
- (b) if so, the details of interest free loan/assistance provided to the States so far under the said scheme including Jammu and Kashmir, State/year-wise;
- (c) the other steps taken/being taken by the Government for capital expenditure/investment across the country, if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether the Government has sanctioned funds under the Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment Scheme for Kerala State during the last two years, if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the total number of projects sanctioned and funds sanctioned under the scheme during the last two years, State-wise?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FINANCE (SHRI PANKAJ CHAUDHARY)

(a) & (b): Yes Sir. The Union Government, in the financial year 2020-21, launched the 'Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure' which was continued in the financial year 2021-22 as well. Thereafter, the Schemes were implemented as the 'Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment' in the financial years 2022-23 and 2023-24 and is being continued in the financial year 2024-25 also. The State-wise and year-wise details of Special Assistance (Loan) provided under the Schemes to the States so far are provided in Annexure 'A'. No releases have been made to the Union Territory (UT) of Jammu & Kashmir as the Scheme is meant only for the States, and not UTs. In case of UTs, financial assistance is provided under different heads by the Ministry of Home Affairs.

(c): The normal Net Borrowing Ceiling (NBC) of the States for the year 2021-22 was fixed at 4% of Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) as recommended by Fifteenth Finance Commission (15th FC). Out of the normal NBC of 4% of projected GSDP for the year 2021-22, borrowing ceiling of 0.50% of the projected GSDP was earmarked for the incremental capital expenditure incurred by the States during 2021-22, for which, a target for capital expenditure was fixed for each State. In FY 2024-25, an incentive amount of Rs. 25,000 crore is earmarked for States who achieve more than 10% growth in Capital Expenditure from their own resources.

(d): In the Financial Year (FY) 2022-23, Rs. 1902.74 crore was released to the State of Kerala. In FY 2023-24, no funds could be released to the State of Kerala due to non-utilization of funds earlier and non-compliance with scheme guidelines.

(e): The State-wise details of number of projects sanctioned under the scheme during the last two years are given in Annexure 'B'. The State-wise and year-wise details of Special Assistance (Loan) provided under the Schemes to the States are provided in Annexure 'A'
